




Where Are We?

North Kohala Community Assessment


We had 100 people from the community fill out our survey.

Top 3 identified threats and hazards:

- 1. Substance Abuse
- 2. Basic Needs
- 3. Self Harm & Suicide

Survey results **reinforced** what the community already knew.

Substance Abuse

We are a small tight knit community and what we see everyday was enforced by the assessment.

- 1. Person unable to function normally and wonders street.
- 2. Person has family, but family has kicked them out because they can no longer take care of them.
- 3. Person unable to hold a job to support family.
- 4. Family broken apart because they are no longer able to live together.

Action:
