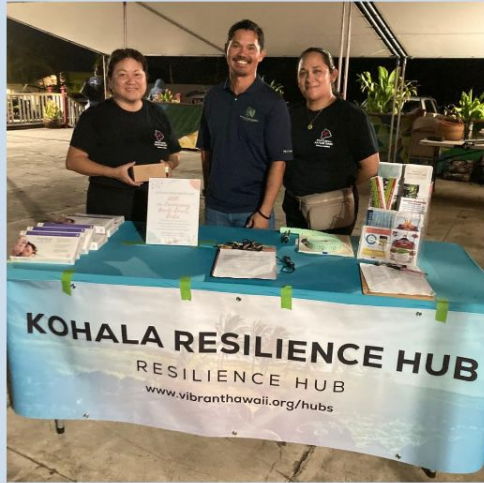

While we continue the work we've done for the past 20 years to support many active community projects, we're excited to announce that we've added two new team members, Kathy Matsuda and Tiana Alcoran-Miyamoto, as well as additional responsibilities.

Are You Prepared for the Next Emergency?

According to Civil Defense, Hawaii Island experiences more types of disasters and weather threats than any other county in the United States. We are a big island with limited resources. North Kohala is particularly isolated from assistance and resources in an emergency.

Due to a limited number of emergency responders, everyone needs to do their part to help keep families and property safe and secure. We can make a difference by preparing in advance. It is important to know what we can expect, how to prepare, what resources are available and how to contact them. Don't get caught by surprise by the next earthquake, storm, flood, tsunami, fire, etc.

Here are a few things to consider:

- Develop a Family Emergency Plan that includes your special needs and pets. Exercise your plan (fire drill, evacuation drill, smoke detector test, check first aid kit, check evacuation kit, etc.)

- Know where your family will

meet if a disaster occurs.

- Check your smoke alarms. Replace old batteries and any alarm over 10 years old.

- Know where your local fire emergency, police station, emergency evacuation shelter and hospital are located.

- Have a list of emergency numbers near or stored in your telephone.

- Prepare your home for high winds, heavy rain and earthquakes. Know safe parts of your house or property to shelter. Know where your community emergency shelters are and local evacuation plans.

- For earthquake damage prevention, secure top-heavy and tall household items such as a water heater or TV to the wall or floor.

- Have at least two ABC-type fire extinguishers in your home. Shake fire extinguishers once a month to keep powder from clumping in the bottom.

- Learn how to safely turn off your electricity, propane tanks and water.

- Prepare by having at least 10 days of food, water and disaster

supplies ready, including special needs and pet care items. Have a Preparedness Kit, First Aid Kit and a Family Go-Bag.

- Consider a neighborhood emergency and communication plan. To what disasters is your neighborhood particularly vulnerable? Be aware of neighbors with special needs.

- Know your first responder resources. Did you know that North Kohala has a volunteer Community Emergency Response Team (NK-CERT) that is trained in disaster response and first aid?

CERT is a program managed by the Hawaii County Civil Defense Authority. CERT provides you with the knowledge and skills to prepare for and properly respond to an emergency. People who complete the free CERT training gain a clear understanding of the potential threats to their home, workplace, and community and more importantly know what steps need to be taken to properly respond to an emergency to reduce losses of life and property. NK-CERT is severely understaffed right now due to the

pandemic and loss of members due to age or leaving the area. Please consider joining NK-CERT as a service to your family, neighborhood and community. Training is free and you will receive an equipment backpack. There will be an Emergency Preparedness meeting on Thursday, February 9, at 5 p.m. in the Kohala Intergenerational Center to discuss these issues and more. If you are interested in how to be better prepared or if you wish to learn more about joining CERT, please attend.

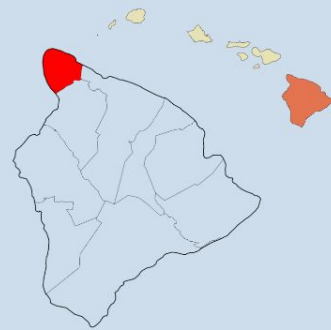
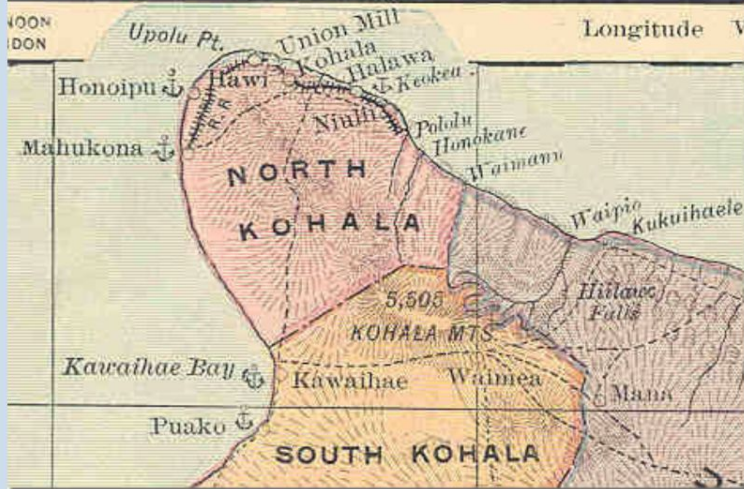
An online training is available. CERT volunteers must take this, but anyone can participate at home without joining CERT. It is suggested that one person from each household take it so they will know what to do in an emergency and take care of their family.

North Kohala Community Assessment


We had **100** people from the community fill out our survey.

Data collection took place at the **Kohala senior citizens meeting**, our **‘ohana fun day health fair**, and the **Kohala night market**.

Top 3 identified threats and hazards:

1. **Substance Abuse**
2. **Basic Needs**
3. **Self Harm & Suicide**

Survey results **reinforced** what the community already knew.

Substance Abuse

We are a small tight knit community and what we see everyday was enforced by the assessment.

1. Person unable to function normally and wonders street.
2. Person has family, but family has kicked them out because they can no longer take care of them.
3. Person unable to hold a job to support family.
4. Family broken apart because they are no longer able to live together.

Action:

- KRH to encourage events providing opportunity for BISAC to be present.
 - BISAC Community Assessment- Q2
 - Food drive - Done 2022
 - Back to school drive -Done 2022

KRH to promote resources on social media, newsletter, flyers, monthly night market booth.

- KRH to host and promote educational classes in partnership with BISAC and other groups that work with substance use and prevention.
 - Naloxone training- Done 2022
 - Suicide Prevention-Done 2022

Health & Wellness

- Quarterly meeting with BISAC to find out goals and progress for Kohala- Q2-Q4
- BISAC to continue work with Kohala Middle & Kohala High School - Q2-Q4

Self Harm/Suicide

1. Parents don't know how to deal with teens self harm.
2. We have lost many young adult males to suicide.

Action:

- KRH team to participate in MHFA online training - Q1
- Certify KRH team member as a MHFA instructor - Q3
- Host live MHFA training - Q4
- Promote MHFA online training within Kohala community - Q4
- Host community run/walk & ho'olaule'a to raise awareness around mental health, suicide, self-harm prevention. Q3

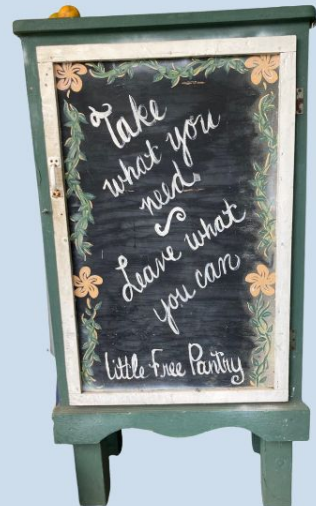
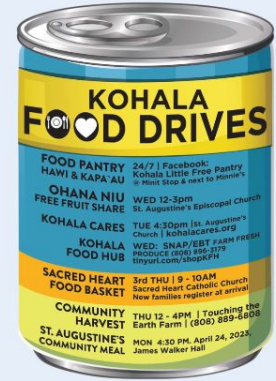

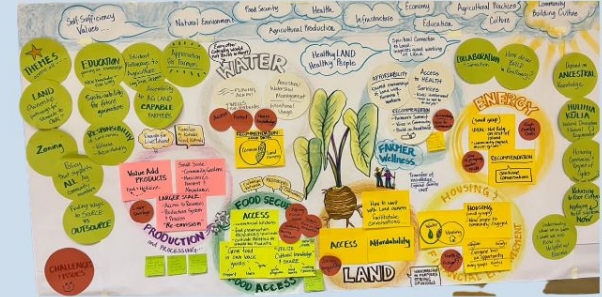
